

Battery Commander's Biography



MAJ Steve Mathers

Major Mathers joined the Australian Army Reserve in November 1985 as a private soldier. He was allocated to the Royal Australian Infantry Corps and subsequently posted to the Western Australian University Regiment as a rifleman. He was promoted to Corporal in 1987 and was responsible for pre-recruit training for Officer Cadets.

He Corps transferred to Royal Australian Artillery in January 1990, and was posted to 7 Field Battery as a Forward Observer's Assistant *. After several years as Command Post Bombardier, he was promoted to Sergeant in 1995 and held the positions of Command Post Sergeant and Battery Commander's Assistant.

After separate periods totaling two years working on construction projects in the UK, Dubai and Jamaica, Major Mathers returned to the Battery and accepted a commission to the rank of Captain in January 2001. The following years saw him fulfilling the role of Forward Observer with both 7 Field Battery and 104 Field Battery in Brisbane, returning to 7 Field Battery as Battery Captain in 2004.

During his 22 year military career he has also held non-corps postings at Brigade Recruiting Cell and the Western Australian University Regiment.


Major Mathers was posted to his current appointment as the Battery Commander of 7 Field Battery, 3 Field Regiment on 1st January 2008.

Major Mathers was educated at South Fremantle Senior High School, matriculating in 1985 and Curtin University of Technology, graduating in 1989 with a Bachelor of Engineering (Civil Engineering) Degree.

In his civilian career, he is a Project Manager for Rio Tinto Iron Ore, responsible for managing the design and construction of iron ore mines and supporting infrastructure projects. He travels regularly to construction projects in the Pilbara. He enjoys cycling, touch rugby, scuba diving and supporting the Western Force in the Super 14 Rugby competition.

<u>DISSOLUTION</u> <u>OF</u> HOBBS AUSTRALIAN ARTILLERY MEMORIAL FOUNDATION

In September 2003 the Foundation was registered with ASIC to basically provide a vehicle through which tax deductible donations could be received and channelled to support the Artillery Associations within Western Australia.

As a registered unlisted Public Company the Foundation was accountable to both the ATO and ASIC.

HAAMF Directors worked diligently toward achieving the objectives stated above.

Despite individual and joint efforts by Board members to overcome the challenges posed by constraints imposed by both the ATO and ASIC, together with the corporate costs involved in maintaining the Foundations registration, clearly indicated the key elements of the Foundation could not, certainly in the short term, be achieved.

It was therefore resolved that the Foundation be dissolved and the energies of the members of the Board be directed, as far as possible, to the support of RAAHS.

I would like to especially thank Don Rae and Andrew Dunjey for the work they did for an on behalf of the Board to try and overcome the ever higher hurdles set by the ATO and ASIC. BEREAVEMENT

Readers will be saddened to learn of the passing of Member James W. Kevan on 8th March 2008. Jim joined the Society on 22 June 1993 and worked diligently in the Photo Archive Section manually accessioning hundreds of donated photographs until October 2006 when a combination of age and poor health prevented his regular attendance. Jim and his wife Jess were offered Honorary Membership of the Society - a gesture they accepted enthusiastically.

Jim provided a link with the past in that he served in 3 Field Brigade AFA pre WW2 and enlisted in the AIF when released by his employer. He was posted the Middle East as a reinforcement to 2/3rd Field Regiment that was in the course of reforming after the disastrous Greece - Crete Campaign. Events changed however and Jim was allotted to the newly formed 2/4th Light Anti-Aircraft Regiment. He took part in the 1942 Battle of El Alamein and returned to Australia in 1943 where after a short stint in North Queensland served in New Guinea in defence of United States Airfields.

Post-war, Jim resumed his role in the banking industry and became involved in Torchbearers for Legacy (the fund raising arm of Legacy) and was an active Legatee who assisted many widows of returned servicemen attain a War Widows Pension.

A Service for Jim was conducted at Karrakatta Crematorium on Friday, 14th March. Jim is survived by his wife Jess and two sons, John and Rod.

UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF KEVIN HAMILTON AND HARVEY EVERETT, A TEAM OF SKILLED ENTHUSIASTS HAS BEEN ABLE TO FULLY RESTORE WORLD WAR 1 TROPHIES FROM THE BATTLEFIELDS OF FRANCE AND BELGUIM INCLUDING THE MANUFACTURE OF WOODEN SPOKED WHEELS – BOTH BRITISH AND GERMAN ALONG WITH AN EXTENSIVE RANGE OF WORLD WAR 2 ORDNANCE.

RESPONSIBLE FOR THE RESTORATION OF THREE "ANCIENT" PIECES OF ORDNANCE. HARVEY EVERETT AND DONALD BONEHAM TRANSFORMED THE 1887 15PR RBL GUN THAT ONCE STOOD PROUDLY AT THE ENTRANCE TO SWAN BARRACKS AND JOHN DRUMMOND BROUGHT BACK TO LIFE TWO 1881 SIR GEORGE ARMSTRONG 3 INCH (12PR) NAVAL MOUNTED GUNS BELONGING TO THE NAVY LEAGUE OF WA.

AUSTRALIAN army gunners are to see active service for the first time since the Vietnam War. Fifteen artillerymen from the Darwin-based 8/12 Medium Regiment will join their British counterparts from the Royal Horse Artillery in Afghanistan's Helmand province as part of an exchange program. Working as a unit, they will operate 105mm L118 Light Guns similar to the Hamel gun in service with the Australian army.

The British guns have a range of 17km and operate from forward bases in Helmand province, which has seen some of the sharpest combat against Taliban insurgents.

The Australians have spent the past six months training in Britain and will be the first of a series of rotations into Helmand province.

PARIS: The last French veteran of World War I, an Italian immigrant who lied about his age to join the Foreign Legion, has died aged 110.

Lazare Ponticelli, the last of more than eight million men who fought under French colours in the 1914-18 war that tore Europe apart, died at the home he shared with his daughter in Paris.

Reflecting on his wartime experiences, he once said: "You shoot at men who are fathers: war is completely stupid."

President Nicolas Sarkozy led tributes to the last "poilu," the affectionate nickname meaning hairy or tough given to French foot soldiers since Napoleonic times.

"Today, I express the nation's deep emotion and infinite sadness," he said.

"I salute the Italian boy who came to Paris to earn his living and chose to become French, first in August 1914, when he lied about his age to sign up at 16 for the Foreign Legion to defend his adopted homeland. Then a second time in 1921, when he decided to remain here for good.

Ponticelli's death came less than two months after that of the penultimate French survivor of the 1914-18 war, Louis de Cazenave, who was also 110 years old.

Germany's last veteran from World War I also died in January this year.

Now there are just nine living veterans worldwide of the conflict. They are:

- Henry Allingham of Britain aged 111. The only survivor to have served from beginning to end of the conflict, he started in the Royal Navy and then ended in the Air Force, seeing action at the Somme.
- Yakup Satar of Turkey aged 109. Signed up in 1915 for the Ottoman Army, worked with the Germans, notably on gas weapons, and was captured in 1917 in what is now Iraq.
- Harry Patch of Britain aged 109. Called up in 1917 and saw action in the trenches of the Belgian front, including during the murderous 3rd Battle of Ypres. Injured by a shell in the same year.
- Delfino Borroni of Italy, 109. Joined an elite unit in 1917 and notably fought against Austro-Hungarian forces in the Tyrol.
- Francesco Chiarello, also of Italy 109. Called up in 1918 and saw action in his country's final battles of the war.
- Frank Buckles, United States aged 107. Joined up by lying about his age when his country entered the war in 1917 and served as an ambulance driver in England and France.
- John Babcock of Canada aged 107. Was sent to Britain as a junior soldier with the Canadian Expeditionary Force in 1917, but did not see action because he was too young.
- Franz Kuenstler of Germany aged 107. Joined a Hungarian artillery unit in February 1918, and served in Italy. Only survivor of the Austro-Hungarian forces.
- Claude Choules of Britain aged 106. Joined the Royal Navy in 1916 and served in the North Sea while only a teenager.
