SMIG 7 Fd Bty Aug 1999 - Nov 2001

Firstly, I would like to thank the RAA Association of WA for given me the opportunity to provide an article for your SITREP segment.

I was lucky enough to receive a posting to 7 Fd Bty in Aug 1999 - 2001 as the SMIG and I must say that it was one of the best times both professional and socially in my career so far. I would especially like to acknowledge Peter Mahoney it was a pleasure to work with you. I recall though that he weren't too happy when I provide him and all the other officers a detailed military guide on how to be a well dress officer and leader. I also recall a certain 'O' Group with the Battery key appointments before a Field Training Exercise (FTX) at good old Lancelin Range. It was my opportunity to pass on SMIGs points. During my address several people would laugh at various stages, after a while I was getting pretty mad and decided that I had had enough and targeted SGT Vic Morrow as to what was so @#\$%^&* funny Vic? Which he replied that I had swore more then 28 times in 4 minutes....Maybe that's why the BC put on my annual report that year, that WO Holstein was not an eloquent speaker! But, it was a good time and it was fun working with Ian Hodgkins, Vic Morrow, Big Dave Graham, Terry Almond (not bad for a Tanky), Eddy Connor and especially Col Turner who we miss so much!...I also enjoyed catching up and having a beer with the boys from the 7 Fd Association and having a chat with Don Rae, to find out what old Artillery equipment or memorabilia he had found, borrowed or received. PERSONNEL RECORDS ENQUIRIES

CARO is concerned to ensure the privacy of ex-service members' is not impinged upon. CARO adheres to the Commonwealth Privacy Act and the values of the Information Privacy Principles for all records under its control. In this respect, copies of information held on personnel files may be provided upon receipt of written authorisation from the ex-member.

If the ex-member is deceased, information may be released upon receipt of written authorisation from the next of kin. In certain other circumstances CARO may be able to issue summarised information. Written requests should include as much of the following details as possible such as:

- Surname and all given names, including any possible names the person may have served under
- Date and place of birth
- Date of death
- Regimental service number(s)
- State of enlistment
- Enlistment and discharge dates
- Rank attained
- Unit(s) served with and location
- Date/s and period/s served
- Details inscribed on any medals or badges, if held.

The enquirer should also provide their:

- Title (Mr/Ms/Mrs/Miss/Dr etc.)
- Name
- Postal address
- Daytime contact telephone number (if available)
- Relationship to person of whom details are being sought
- Reason for seeking information.

THE MEMORIAL TO NATIONAL SERVICEMEN

Background: In April 2002, the National Servicemen's Association of Australia Inc (NSAA) made a request for formal recognition of national service to occur at the Australian War Memorial (AWM). In August 2002, Council agreed that a fountain (or bench) would be appropriate. Subsequent correspondence with the NSAA resulted in reservation of a fountain site directly east of the front entrance of the main building in the proposed Memorial Courtyard.

Development of the Memorial Courtyard, and the National Service Memorial it contains, is contingent on the larger development of the Eastern Precinct. A National Service Memorial Advisory Group comprising ADNC, Head Art, Head Buildings and Services and representatives of the NSAA has been formed.

The Advisory Group has developed a design commission brief with key elements of the brief being:

- The National Service Memorial commemorates those who served as national servicemen under the two schemes created under the National Service Act 1951 (1951-59) and the National Service Act 1964 (1965-72).
- The design concept is a simple and dignified fountain which does not compete, but be sympathetic to and complement the AWM existing architecture.
- The Memorial Courtyard is a formal architecture and landscape design which includes geometric paved and grass areas and facility for placement of commemorative plaques on the perimeter. The National Service memorial is the centrepiece of the Memorial Courtyard and will be constructed with noble materials in sympathy with the site.
- The design must be environmentally sensitive in terms of water and energy use and the design should minimise, as far as possible, ongoing maintenance requirements and any potential for vandalism or defacement.
- A notional budget for design and construction of \$350,000 (inclusive of a 6% per annum increase during the period 2007-2010).

Architects, Johnson Pilton Walker (JPW) were commissioned to prepare a design for the memorial, and subsequently came up with a sleek, modern design that eloquently depicts each of the armed services.

Design Concept: The concept responds to the brief and forms the centre piece of the new eastern courtyard. The planning of a central fountain contained within the larger eastern court and defined by paving, low English box hedging and seating allows for quiet contemplation by small to medium sized groups.



The design also allows for larger gatherings with good sightlines from the whole eastern area. The three services are represented by the service badges and by the symbolic representation of earth, water and sky (sandstone, the fountain and sky reflections off polished black granite). The three services are also represented by the triangular bronze inner element, which symbolise their integral role of the armed services to National Service.

The materials chosen have direct relationship to the Australian War Memorial: the bronze of the fountain as used in the roll of honour, the sandstone paving and outer plinth as used in the memorial building, and the black granite fountain base as used in other memorials in the western precinct. The foundation is designed with the need to conserve precious water resources. Water will be used sparingly and from recycled sources. The memorial has been designed to look equally attractive should severe periods of drought make it necessary to temporarily restrict or eliminate the use of water in the fountain.

In September 2007, copies of the design proposal were then sent to each of the 139 Sub-Branches and fraternal associations around the country with a request for members' approval to be provided by end of December 2007. An overwhelming approval from members has resulted in 'go ahead' instructions to be issued to the Australian War Memorial and the architects.

Memorial Dedication Events The dates for the Dedication events have now been confirmed for September 7 and 8, 2010 with the dedication of the National Servicemen's Memorial scheduled for Wednesday, September 8, 2010.

Immediate family members (i.e. mother, father, brother, sister, wife, son or daughter) of the 212 deceased National Servicemen interested in attending the dedication should log on the website and complete the form provided. KIWI LONG TAN VETERAN AWARDED

A Vietnam War veteran has been honoured with a rare award at a surprise lunch in Auckland. Seventy-eight-year-old Morrie Stanley was one of three Kiwi's involved in the battle of Long Tan during the Vietnam War in 1966. Stanley thought he was off to a casual lunch with a few old friends on Saturday, but instead he was stunned by a surprise ceremony to honour him.

"I expected a small lunch with a group of the artillery association," says Stanley. He was presented with the rare Australian Unit Citation for Gallantry, the first Kiwi to get the award. It has only ever been given to two other Australian units - the SAS in Iraq and the commandos in Afghanistan.

The moment was too much Stanley who is suffering from terminal cancer. "You saw me weep this morning. I've been doing that a lot lately," he says. The award recognises Stanley's actions as Captain of a three-man artillery unit that was supporting 105 Australian troops fighting more than 2,000 Viet Cong at Long Tan.

Stanley's comrade, Harry Smith, says he was lying in the mud next to him while Stanley gave directions to 24 artillery guns to fire on the enemy position. "I have said to others, I wouldn't be talking to you now if it hadn't been for Morrie Stanley and his guns," says Smith.

VIP VISIT to LEIGHTON BATTERY

A visit to the Leighton Battery Heritage Site was undertaken by the Shadow Minister for Defence, Senator The Hon. David Johnston on Tuesday 8 June 2010. He was accompanied by Don Randall MP, Member for Canning and the endorsed Liberal candidate for Fremantle, Matt Taylor together with staff from the Senator's office. In addition, the group included Denise Cahill, the Editor of the Community News Group – Western Suburbs.

The group was met by RAAHS President, Bruce Campbell and members of the Society including Ronnie Roach, Don Rae, John Walsh, Roger Martin, Ray Bird and Vicki Ide (in her capacity as photographer). The visitors were on site for over two hours which included a comprehensive tour of the facilities concluding with some typical "Gunner hospitality".

The visit was considered a great success as it provided the guests with an understanding and appreciation of the role of the facility during the wartime era and its subsequent development and restoration as a historical and heritage Artillery site.

Generally, there was a previous lack of awareness regarding the LBHS, however all indicated that the quality of the tour and the range of displays were of a very high quality. The elected representatives indicated strong support for the planned enhancement program and offered to assist wherever they could. The visit therefore was an important PR exercise as it established the potential for direct lines of communication between the RAAHS and the WA based Federal Parliament representatives.

At the time of writing this article, it is not known the extent of any media coverage in the Community News, however, as the Editor and a photographer made a subsequent visit to the site, it is anticipated a worthwhile article will appear.

Overall, the visit by this VIP group was regarded as a real plus and it was rated as an important step in creating further awareness to key people in the WA community.
