PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Fellow Gunners,

Bob Farrelly, our President is back at Harvard absorbing yet more knowledge - although very recent intelligence suggests he might only have got as far as Lancelin as this goes to print.

This year I attended two diverse and quite separate Anzac Day events. First in my ADF capacity as 2IC of the WA Cadet Brigade I attended the annual Anzac Day service at the Banksia Hill Detention Centre for young offenders in the week before Anzac day. The entire service was planned, organised and conducted by the detainees and supported by detainee cadets who belong to B Company 509 ACU and a small element of the cadet band. The available detainee population attended the service. It was extremely well conducted and a credit to the efforts of all involved.

I will expand on this experience in a later edition. Although it's not the type of facility one strives to end up in, from what I was able to see during that event, considerable effort is going into providing an environment and guidance to assist the detainees to turn their lives around. B Company, 509 ACU is as far as I am aware unique and detainees volunteer to become members of it. As you might imagine the qualities of courage, initiative and teamwork are not necessarily concepts that some of these young people would readily identify with so fair play to them for accepting that additional challenge.

I then travelled to Broome together with a small number of other gunners for the actual Anzac Day march; once again a more detailed article later. However the march went extremely well and there were many veterans there from all round Australia and it was poignant to reflect in the pre-dawn overlooking Roebuck Bay that it was the 70th anniversary of the first bombing of Broome which resulted in considerable loss of life most of them women and children escaping from Java.

Locally there is plenty happening on the artillery establishment front, most of it unwelcome as far as old gunners would be concerned but a sign of the times nonetheless. Change is upon us whether we like it or not and this serves as a timely reminder that maintaining gunner traditions and esprit de corps is more important than ever. I urge all members to get interested and work towards ensuring our history is retained and that members of the gunner community remain connected.

B.C.'s NOTE

Fellow Gunners,

2012 was always going to be a significant year for change but significant is turning into dramatic. Due to federal budget pressures there have been widespread delays in expenditure including a modest reduction in Army Reserve Training Salaries and the cancellation of the Self Propelled Howitzer (instead more towed M777s will be procured).

Project Beersheba however continues with all ARES units undergoing a unit establishment review with an expectation that ARES Artillery will emerge as a small headquarter element at 2 DIV and one mortar battery per ARES BDE. Whilst this is causing upheaval in the other states, WA has operated along these lines for

many years. Formation into a Battle Group construct and coming under command though is bringing its own set of challenges. Additionally the relocation of 11/28 BN HQ into Hobbs Artillery Park due to the condemning of their barracks at Retimo Lines (originally Anti-Aircraft Hall built in 1942) has made space a lot tighter.

It is likely that all ARES FD REGTs will be disestablished as a result of these changes and 7 FD BTY will become 7 MOR BTY. 3 FD REGT will disappear from the ORBAT.

The annual BTY Birthday/Artillery Regimental Mixed Dinner Sat 7th July will be an especially poignant event for this reason. I encourage all gunners whatever their heritage to make a special attempt to attend this dinner, an invitation with full details is included in this newsletter.

BDR Gavin Bonser, a long serving member of 7 FD BTY is fighting Lymphoma and receiving chemotherapy treatment. Our thoughts are with Gavin, Shelley and his children as they keep their spirits up through this difficult time.

Inaugural ANZAC Day Event Welcomed By RAAHSWA

Yet another Australian sport has chosen to mark ANZAC Day commemorations with a special round. The Western Australian Hockey Association has given a ringing endorsement to the conduct, each year, of a special round of hockey between two Perth clubs, local rivals, Victoria Park Xavier Hockey Club and Wesley South Perth Hockey Club in the Melville Toyota League competition at the WAHA stadium in Bentley.

In early April 2012, Mr Peter Sarre of the Vic Park Panthers approached the Royal Australian Artillery Historical Society of WA (Inc) requesting a donation of an artefact of WW1 significance which could be mounted to serve as a perpetual trophy for the event. RAAHSWA has donated an 18 pounder cartridge case, struck in 1916 and this now forms the centre piece of a magnificent trophy constructed of Jarrah timber, reclaimed from the old East Fremantle Football Club rooms. The society's donation was warmly received by both clubs and advertising material for both the tunnels and Project 2013 were on prominent display throughout the event.

In true ANZAC spirit the game was a skilful affair, hard fought with Wesley South Perth Wasps taking an early lead before Panthers equalised going into the break. Wasps proved to have a sting in their tail after half time going on to secure a 4-2 victory and claim the debut trophy. Phil Rowson representing the Historical Society attended to award the trophy to Wasps Captain Jayme Walsh. WAHA Board President, Peter Churack made the presentation to Most Valuable Player, Kiel Brown of Wasps. The MVP trophy is a replica Pattern 3 Rising Sun Collar Badge as worn by ANZAC troops in 1915. The badge was mounted on printed card with a short description of its significance.

Both Clubs now look forward to next year's event being an all Wasps V Panthers event with the Ladies teams joining the event to make it a whole club fixture at the stadium.

Shadow Tactical Unmanned Aerial System commences Afghan operations

The Shadow 200 Tactical Unmanned Aerial System (TUAS) has officially commenced operations in Afghanistan, providing an enhanced capability to the International Security Assistance Force.

The Shadow 200 TUAS is designed to conduct Intelligence, Surveillance, Target Acquisition and Reconnaissance (ISTAR) operational support, enhancing the decision cycle of the support force element, through the employment of its sensors.

The Shadow 200 TUAS replaces the ScanEagle which has been in operation since mid 2007

Chief of Joint Operations, Lieutenant General Ash Power said the ScanEagle has provided constant intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance support to ground elements 24/7 for nearly five years.

"During that time the ScanEagle has made significant contributions to the force protection and situational awareness of the Coalition Force soldier on the ground," Lieutenant General Power said.

"This was an average of 22 hours per day over the four years and 10 month period - a tremendous effort. Approximately 180 ADF personnel deployed in support of ScanEagle, with the bulk from 20th Surveillance and Target Acquisition Regiment. Other contributing units include 16 Air Defence Regiment, Defence Imagery and Geospatial Organisation, 1st Topographical Survey Squadron and 16 Aviation Brigade.

"ScanEagle has been the vehicle for the Australian Army to develop its Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) capability and the Army is now taking the next step by employing the Shadow 200 TUAS," Lieutenant General Power added.

Since being deployed to Afghanistan mid 2007 the ScanEagle has flown approximately 32,000 hours in Afghanistan and over 6,200 missions in support of the Reconstruction Task Force, Mentoring and Reconstruction Task Force, Mentoring Task Force, Combined Team - Uruzgan and the Special Operations Task Group.


