The Battery Birthday mixed dining in night was held on 4 July with nearly 100, current serving and past gunners and their partners attending Hobbs Artillery Park. In early August the battery deployed to Lancelin and conducted our live fire assessment for the Mount Schanck Trophy. PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Dear Members,

Welcome to the Spring edition of Aiming Post.

For those who have followed the progress of the Eagles and the Dockers I am sure you were well pleased with their efforts this season!

On the 4th of July several members and I attended the 67th Anniversary Dinner for 3rd Light Battery. The formal event was held at the Hobbs drill hall. The venue looked terrific as did the guests- with the ladies in their finery and the gents in suits/mess dress. Some 90 people attended- the company was excellent, as was the meal and Regimental Port.

To matters Leighton:

- A recent addition to the 'enlistment room' is a very impressive cabinet display of service medals and ribbons-all captioned. This beautifully lit display is a credit to members Bob Arnold, Don Rae and Mery Ward.
- Down in the tunnel commemoration room now resides a new Honour Board with the names of the 14
 members of 3RD Field Brigade plus 1 from each of the 1ST and 2ND Brigades who were killed at
 Gallipoli. The 16 men were all from Western Australia. Member Phil Allen re arranged the lighting to
 complement the panel set.
- Members may recall member Malcolm Higham's models of the 6" and 5.25" gun floors and support tunnels. These have now been re-furbished .Member John O'Brien has been completing a number of R.A.A. figures that will further enhance these scenes. Both now sit inside a magnificent cabinet back lit- thanks to the efforts of members Don, Ron, Merv and Harvey.
- A new cash register now has put a smile on the faces of our marvellous band of cashiers.
- The 6" shield is now ready for its final lift onto the barrel. Special cast steel footings will be bolted onto load bearing concrete pours. The shield weighs about 7 tonnes.

- Three new all weather data panels have now been cemented for public viewing. One sits before the Bofors L.A.A. weapon, the second before the 3.7" H.A.A. weapon and the third in front of the 1940's loading ramp.
- Members Stan Davies and Don Rae have progressed the concept of a full scale 6" gun barrel and shield to now having asked for construction quotes from several fabricators. The W.A. Planning Commission and T.O.M.P. have given permission to site the all-weather steel outline where it can be clearly seen by Stirling Highway traffic 7 days a week .Suitably captioned, it is another quality step forward for our tunnel complex.

The Society has now received the final draft of the Site Interpretation Plan. Members of a sub-committee are carefully examining it. The Plan will enable future requests for Lotterywest funding to be made with a higher degree of obtaining it.

Our two workshop stalwarts- Harvey Everitt and Phil Pougnault have now fully rebuilt the 105mm pack howitzer the Society lent to the S.A.S.R. as a training aide. The gun only awaits its paint scheme. Well done those men!

Before concluding, I wish our esteemed member Merv Ward the best possible outcome on his recently diagnosed illness. Merv your friends in the Society are thinking of you and your family.

My thanks go to all members (and their spouses) who have advanced the Society's interests these past several months. In the next edition I hope to be able to introduce the wider membership to two new guides-in-training!
